SUBJECT: Approval of Resolution No. 23-02, The Nature Foundation of Will County 2024

Budget

Background

Attached, please find Resolution No. 23-02, the Nature Foundation's 2024 Budget, presented as Exhibit A. This budget supports the projects, programs and initiatives outlined by the Board of Directors. As presented in Resolution No. 23-02, the total operating resources for 2024 are \$1,239,044 as follows:

The Foundation will begin 2024 with a healthy beginning balance due to two legacy gifts and a year of successful fundraising with financial support coming from individual donors, private foundations, grants, and Invest in Nature corporate and business partnerships. Projected new income for the year is \$204,500. However, this is modest, and the Foundation has a history of exceeding its yearly revenue projections.

The budget includes \$857,215 in expenditures. Of that, \$678,780 or 80% is set aside to fulfill specific gift or grant agreements and fund the Forest Preserve's capital projects and programs from individual donations. The remaining 20% or \$178,435 is funding for administration, the Foundation's core programs and events like the native plant sales, and its other fundraising functions.

As presented, the 2024 budget is showing a net loss in operating revenue of -\$652,715 largely due to the \$678,780 commitment to the Forest Preserve's capital projects. Funding to cover the net loss is provided by the year end carry over reflected in the \$1,020,544 beginning balance.

The \$518,384 of expenditures made from restricted funds includes projects like the remaining funding for the Lake Chaminwood Preserve Improvements as well as projects and programs made possible by funding from Enbridge Alliance, Pembina, the Bass Pro Shops & Cabela's Outdoor Fund, Target, the Vulcan Materials Company Foundation, the Sgt. Thomas M. Gilbert Memorial Foundation, and the Joliet Bicycle Club.

In addition, the Foundation will reimburse the Forest Preserve District approximately \$30,996 for programs and projects funding in 2023 for which the Foundation has not yet processed the reimbursements.

Finally, the Foundation expects to provide \$79,400 in funding to the Forest Preserve in 2024 for new funding requests made by the Forest Preserve to the Foundation.
